





Pupils have **RIGHTS**. At the same time, and equally as important, they have **RESPONSIBILITIES**. In addition, they are expected to **RESPECT** themselves, others and the environment. If pupils fail to act responsibly and show a lack of respect, members of staff have the right to apply appropriate sanctions.











RIGHTS

Pupils have the right to:

-  high quality teaching;
-  be encouraged to do their best;
-  a caring, supportive and disciplined learning environment;
-  a range of extra-curricular activities and the encouragement to participate.







RESPONSIBILITIES

Pupils are expected to:

-   make it as easy as possible for everyone to learn and for the teacher to teach;
-  join in, aim high, and try hard;
-  if in doubt, ask questions;
-  do homework and hand it in on time;
-  bring the right equipment and clothing to each lesson;
-  be on time for lessons;
-  wear school uniform;
-  eat in the dining room, garden or picnic area - never in a classroom, corridor or on the field;
-  put litter in a bin.

RESPECT

Means pupils should:

-   praise themselves when they do well and praise others when they are successful;
-  appreciate the feelings of others and act sensitively;
-  never humiliate others verbally or physically;
-  never bring hazardous objects or substances to school;
-  take care of their own property and value that of others.
